League Game 12th January 2023 Caterham Pumas 1 – 5 Coulsdon Athletic FC

A bit delayed but Sunday saw the return to league games, our first since before Christmas, which was one to forget, so maybe the break will have done us some good. We hit back with a win last week in the Cup - so the first challenge now is we need back to back wins after our up 'n' down patch.
